Phillip Legare started his martial arts training in Kung Fu in New Orleans in 1969 at age 13 and then trained in the 70s in Chugoku Kukempo under Japanese martial arts/samurai legend Shoen Fukuda who also had menkyo kaiden in Takagi Yoshin Ryu and Koto Ryu under Hatsumi Soke.

Mr. Legare began formal training in the Bujinkan in 1982, passed the Go-dan test in 1989 and was awarded JuGo dan in 2003. He has lived in Japan for approximately 10 years between 1974 and 2007 and currently visits Japan once or twice yearly for training at hombu.

Shinken Taijutsu

Legare sensei has received an additional menkyo kaiden from Hatsumi Soke in 1996 for shinkengata (real world applications of budo taijutsu) and gone on to teach protection training based on shinkengata to more than 3,000 U.S. government and military personnel traveling into harm's way since 1996.

What to Bring:

Tachi (bokken or iaito),
Wooden and or padded jo-staff
rope, training knife, jutte,
Training folding knife and collapsible
baton if you have them.

What not to Bring:

Any video or audio recording devices
sharp weapons, illegal items or
bad attitudes!

Shihan Legare was honored with the Bujinkan warrior name of *Taka-Seigi* (Hawk of Justice) along with menkyo kaiden as a "Guardian of the Bujinkan." He went on to establish the *Bujinkan Taka-Seigi Dojo* in the early 90s and is currently headquartered in Rockville, Maryland. Over the years, many of Phil's students have gone on to become Judan or above. Currently two former students are now at the ultimate rank of 15th dan. He is the recipient of 4 Bujinkan Gold Dragon medals, received an award from the Japan Literary Guild for best martial arts movie of the year (2001), and has hosted three international Taikai featuring Hatsumi Soke in 1993, 1998 & 2001.
